ometimes, like that isherman, we throw back the big plans, big dreams, big jobs, big opportunities that God gives us. Our faith is too small. We laugh at that fisherman who didn't figure out that all he needed was a bigger frying pan; yet how ready are we to increase the size of our faith? Whether it's a problem or a possibility, God will never give you anything bigger than you can handle. That means we can confidently walk into anything God brings our way. You can do all things through Christ. (Philippians 4:13). Nothing is too big for God.

(2) House of Hope: Most of our resources of time and money go to children whose primary caregivers abandoned them. Countless parents were slain in the war. We now care for 150 in Adwa, Ethiopia. Our local oversight leaders (Evangelists and Pastors) are hiring new House Mothers, Cooks, & Office Staff. Teame (circled), our newest Board member, traveled at his own ex-

pense this summer to gather info and bless our children! He will share at our banquet. Currently, our kids are returning to rebuilt classrooms (over



88% were destroyed), & therefore they need new uniforms, and school supplies. 150 pairs of quality right-size shoes were just purchased in the Capital for their busy feet. 3. City of God: When our At-Risk kids graduate at 18 years of age, a few obtain scholarships, or receive special career opportunities (often to become pastors) which require additional temporary support. We also provide for mothers with children, who are exiled from their communities after they choose to become followers of Jesus. PRAY FOR PEACE in the HORN OF AFRICA! The LORD and our Board are sending me back to the UN Tigrayan Refugee Camps in UGANDA this October. Christian families and orphans there are



suffering greatly. Because of the five-month civil war in Sudan, now on average, 17,000 children per day fall into crisis levels of hunger there alone. The President of Ethiopia, who just made peace with the Tigrayans, now wages war against the **Amharas**. Millions are fleeing to **Uganda**, which has a well deserved reputation for caring for refugees. In fact, one of our key partner pastors has fled there with his entire family, and will help me locate and serve many needy believers. I'm counting on your prayers and support as I prepare to minister AID and Gospel Hope.
