replace the one who reconnected with parents.



THE HORN OF AFRICA IS UNRAVELING



t is difficult to recall when more things were going all wrong! In Sudan, a city of five million has two large well supplied armies fighting a bloody civil war. Citizens are dying, starving, or fleeing. The Eritrean dictator refuses to remove troops from Tigray (Ethiopia) while kidnapping refugees who have fled to both Sudan and Ethiopia, bringing them back for imprisonment and forced labor. Multiple rebellions are happening in Yemen, Somalia and Ethiopia itself. The war in Tigray was the deadliest conflict globally last year with over 100,000 recorded deaths (more than the wars in Ukraine, Yemen, Myanmar, Nigeria, Somalia, Mali and Burkina Faso combined.*) Everywhere, children suffer most. Their little bodies require nutritious foods daily. An estimated 30% of children in the Tigray region now face "acute malnutrition" while millions more than are in need of food assistance.

he situation is about to get worse. Samantha Power, head of US AID, is suspending deliveries to Ethiopia's northern regions due to the "widespread and coordinated" theft involving tribal, state and federal criminal collusion resulting in "a systemic failure" by her agency.

We thank God that He continues to provide opportunities to support those in Tigray He has entrusted to us. We are grieved beyond measure as many report their personal pain and calamities. We recognize Satan's attacks on this beloved region, and ask you to join with us in placing the HORN OF AFRICA and every precious person into the Father's strong hands.

Pray As For Our <u>Newest Board</u> <u>Member</u> Investigates Tigray




