In Luke Chapter 24 we read the story of two men making their way from Jerusalem to a the small village of Emmaus about seven miles from Jerusalem. It was on the evening of the third day after the conviction and crucifixion of Jesus. As they make their way along the road and are sad, Jesus joins them, but is unrecognized by them. Seeing their sad

countenances, Jesus inquires as to the reason for their sadness?

One of the men, Cleopas, says, "are you a stranger to Jerusalem not knowing of the trial and execution of one Jesus?" "What things" says Jesus. "The things concerning Jesus of Nazareth Who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before GOD and all the people," they reply. They also offer their belief that He was the One who would redeem Israel, adding that they had heard a report that certain women had seen angels who said that Jesus was alive, and indeed the tomb where He laid was empty! At this point Jesus, still not recognized by the men said, "O fools and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken: ought not Christ to have suffered these things and entered into His glory." Then beginning at Moses and the prophets He opened their eyes to the

wonderful truths concerning Himself. As the men were now drawing near their destination, Jesus made as if to go on, but they constrained Him to come in with them and stay the night. He consented and they entered the house to enjoy the evening meal. As He broke bread before, which they had probably witnessed many times, their eyes were opened. As they recognized Him their emotions soared, but He vanished from their sight. Later they would describe the moment saying, "did not our hearts burn within us while He talked with us on the road." This truth caused them to rise up and return to Jerusalem that very hour.

Can you feel the joy, the elation they felt upon realizing that their Lord was alive? The truth is that He is alive today and will open the hearts to wonderful scriptural truths to any who will break the bread of life with Him!

Jimma. He became an evangelist in churches and on the street. He was so effective, that it was arranged in 1974 for him to get an advanced education in the USA at **Biola** University. While obtaining his BA, he also organized bible study groups with his countrymen, which served as the nucleus for the First Ethiopian Christian Church in **Downey**, California. He also met Susan, who became his wife and mother of 3 wonderful children

After earning a Masters of Divinity degree from **Talbot Seminary**, Shoan's family moved to Kenya conducting a radio ministry both to Ethiopians and Kenyans in two languages.

Upon his return to the USA due to his divorce, he practiced a tent making ministry teaching school, while with others founding Ethiopian Emanuel Evangelical Church in **Anaheim**, CA.



In 1998, Shoan married Aynalem (Negest), gaining 3 more children (and eventually 9 grandkids!). Together, at considerable personal sacrifice, they founded "Hope for Horn of Africa" ministries, establishing HOUSE OF HOPE for orphans, and CITY OF GOD to shelter recent converts with Muslim backgrounds. They also trained pastors and evangelists, working towards the unity of the African churches in that region, with some 80 tribes, and many Christian denominations.

As most of you are aware, Shoan suffered a major stroke 6 years ago, which greatly impaired his mobility and communication abilities until his death Jan.16. However, he had a powerful homecoming both in heaven and here, where hundreds

gathered at Christ Lutheran Church in Phoenix Jan. 19, to celebrate his life.

Shoan's pilgrimage is completed, but his witness lives on! Many of us think, "Who am !? What difference can I make?" We can't by ourselves do anything, but we are NOT by ourselves. The LIFE of CHRIST is




inside us, and He is **partnering** with us. Jesus said, "THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS LIKE YEAST..." If you take **three pounds** of dough and hide a **few ounces of yeast** in it, you would say that that yeast is **hopelessly outnumbered**. BUT that little bit of yeast, like the little mustard seed, has LIFE in it! The yeast is not lost in the meal—actually it changes the entire dough, penetrating it with a life and power within itself.
